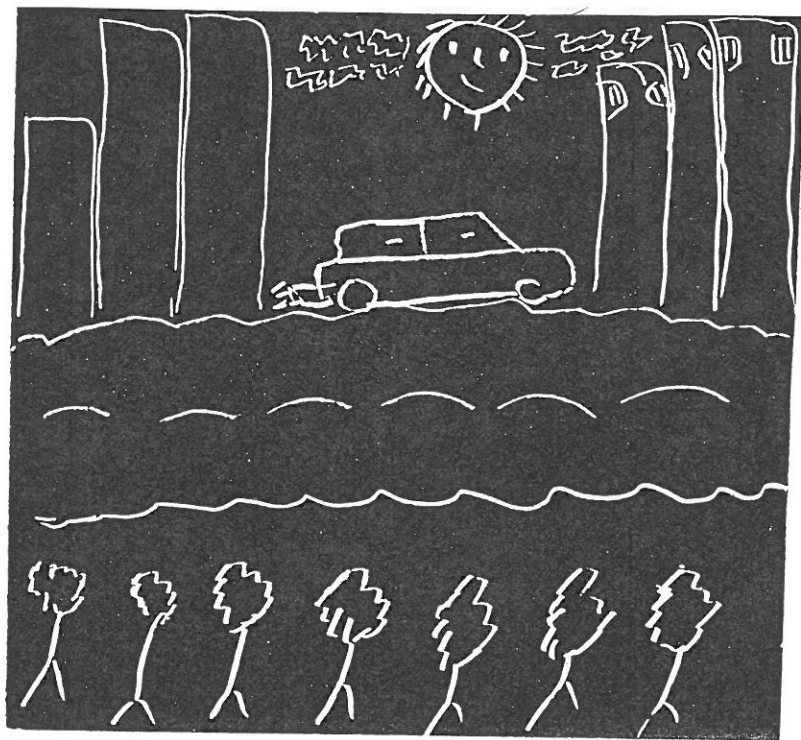

The environment is a good thing because without the environment people could not live, breathe or eat, and kids would not have a place to play with each other.

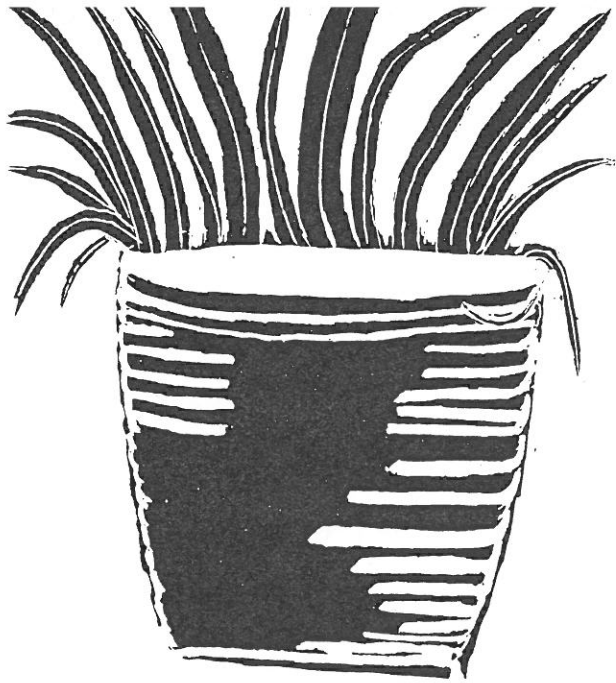

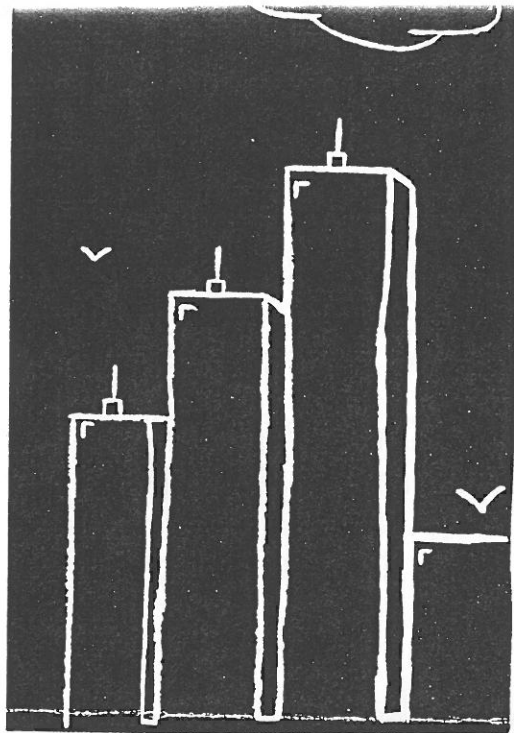




The environment consists of many living things. One of those many living things is plants. Plants are all over our environment. Just like we need certain things to live, plants also need certain things to live.

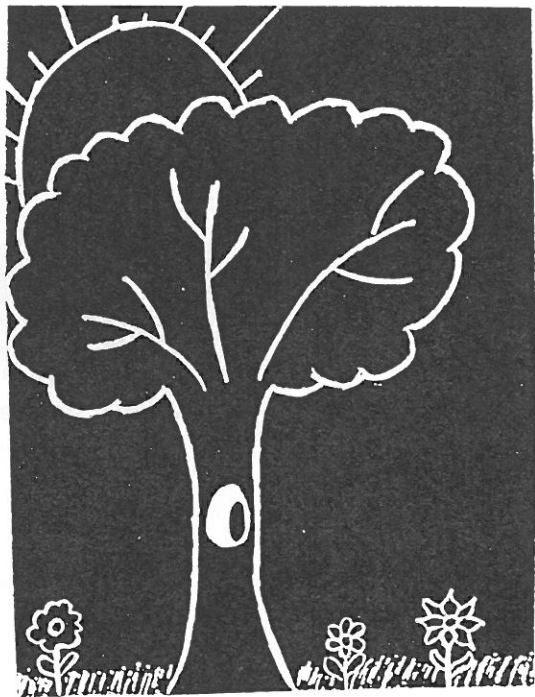

I think about the environment most of the time.

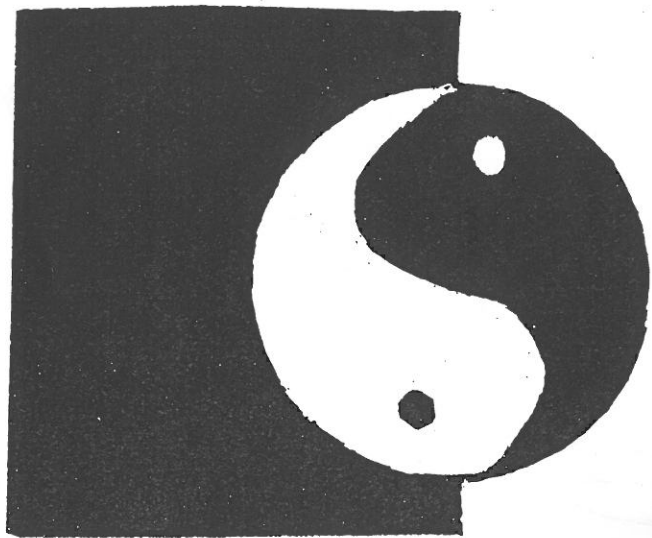

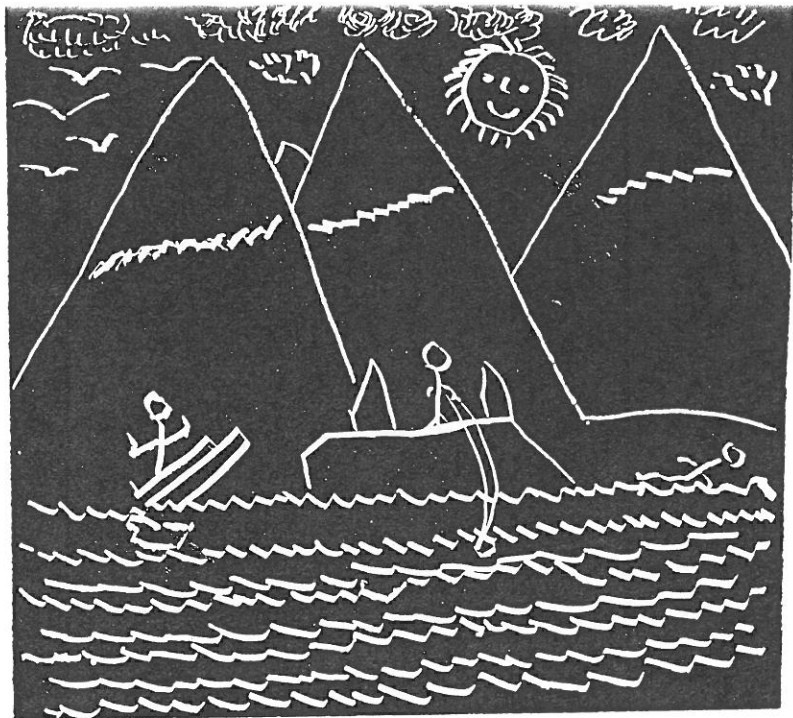




As I Look in the Sky

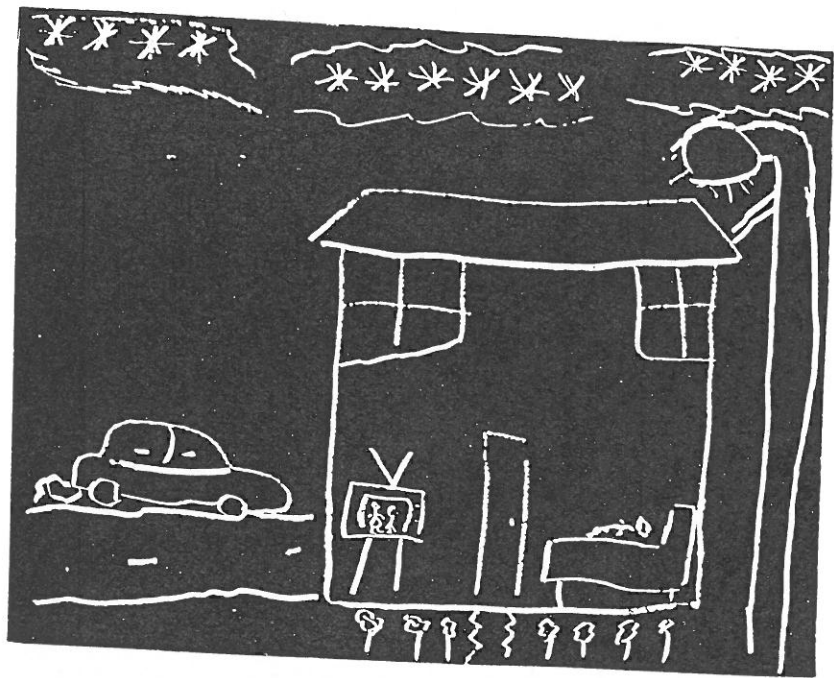
As I look in the sky
